





Christmas presents oftentimes are a simple way to remind someone you care.

This time of the year also can help express an important milestone for couples and family members.

One shop in Seymour can cover both ends of the gift-giving spectrum to offer a classic, never-fail gift: Tiemeier's Jewelry.

"You cannot go wrong with jewelry as a gift," said Melissa Reutter, who owns the store with her husband, Greg. "And since we can do it with all sorts of budgets, it makes it easier."

The store offers everything from necklaces and rings, to bracelets and watches, to everything in between. They also offer repairs and cleaning services.

The store at 101 N. Chestnut St. has been in the Reutter family since 1964, and Melissa and Greg purchased the business from Greg's father in 1987.

The store also is known for decorating its large, two-story wall on the outside to look like a large Christmas package.

"We saw a picture in a magazine where a store in New York did the same thing, only it was a much taller building," Melissa said. "We always thought it was cool and like doing it."

A look through the cases at the store also will show customers a variety of types and styles of jewelry, including classics like white gold, yellow gold, stainless steel, sterling silver and more. You'll find diamonds, gemstones and whatever style of jewelry you're looking for.

One unique option is the enamel jewelry by designer Nicole Barr.

Melissa said each vibrant piece is hand-painted by designers who go through a long-term apprenticeship before they're able to paint the jewelry.

After painting, it is then "baked" for the finish.

"They're really great, and it's incredible the detail that you can see," she said. "It's hard to imagine being able to paint these."

The flexible Bella Cavo bracelets by Kelly Waters are another unique and affordable option. The lightweight bracelets feature diamonds and multiple designs and can be adjusted on the wrist.

Those can be perfect for women with smaller wrists and like a contemporary piece.

But Tiemeier's Jewelry does not only offer gifts for women. There are plenty of items for men, as well.

The store offers a line of Citizen brand watches, other watch brands, pocket watches and a line of Groove silicone rings and Groove belts. Reutter said the belts are good for conceal carry.

“We also have the stainless steel or sterling silver cross necklaces that are popular for people to get for men,” Reutter said.

The store also has its inventory ready for the holiday season. Tiemeier's is fully stocked with everything customers may want.

“We're loaded up with inventory, and we're ready,” Reutter said. “It's so much easier than having to order in, and with higher postage, it helps having inventory here.”

One item that may come up with the holidays is engagement. Reutter said Christmas isn't necessarily the most common time people get engaged, but New Year's can be, and it is never a bad time to inform those who

are considering popping the question.

Reutter said finger size is the biggest question when buying an engagement ring, and there are a few tricks to help find out the size.

“You can always ask mom or a sister,” she said. “Or if she already has a ring, you could put it on your finger and get it close.”

Other considerations are the preferred colors and styles.

Until Jan. 29, the store at 4329 N. U.S. 31 is offering a Hot Buys promotion for many of these items that will include special discounts, rebates and free items for certain purchases.

One of the most commonly used household tools is a drill, and there are plenty of great deals on different drill driver kits from Winsupply that will be carried on through the holiday season.

An M12 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>8</sub>-inch drill/driver and <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>-inch hex impact driver combo kit, including batteries, a charger and a carry case, is available for \$109, reduced from the previous price of \$169.

Additionally, the purchase of different drill and driver kits will include an additional M18 REDLITHIUM XC5.0 battery via e-rebate, a \$159 value.

Those kits include the M18 FUEL ½-inch drill/driver set, \$289; M18 FUEL ½-inch hammer drill/driver kit, \$299; M18 FUEL ¼-inch hex impact driver kit, \$299; and M18 FUEL SURGE ¼-inch hex hydraulic driver kit, \$329.

One of the largest savings promotions offered by Winsupply during the holiday season is for the M18 FUEL four-tool combo kit, which includes an M18 FUEL ½-inch hammer drill, an M18 FUEL ¼-inch impact driver, an M18 FUEL oscillating multi-tool M18 LED flashlight, an M18 high-output 6.0Ah battery and an M18 high-output 3.0Ah battery.

Normally, this package would cost \$953;

however, until Jan. 29, it is discounted to \$599.

On top of that discount, anyone who purchases this combo kit can get two additional M18 bare tools free via e-rebate. These tools range in value from \$149 to \$199.

For anyone who already has plenty of Milwaukee M18 tools, the REDLITHIUM M18 batteries, which are compatible with all 200+ M18 tools from the brand, could be a good option.

Winsupply's Hot Buys promotion includes a few deals on batteries.

The purchase of an M18 REDLITHIUM high-output XC8.0 battery, \$199, includes a free M18 REDLITHIUM high-output CP3.0 battery, a \$119 value, via e-rebate.

A two-pack of those CP3.0 batteries is discounted to \$99, down \$80 from the

original price of \$179.

The M18 REDLITHIUM XC5.0 starter kit, which includes one battery and a charger, is marked down from \$199 to \$149 in the promotion.

The M18 line also includes power supplies, one of which is included in the promotional sale, the M18 top-off 175W power supply. With an XC5.0 battery included, this bundle is being sold for \$149.

Other Milwaukee products sold by Winsupply include protective gear, like knee-pads, glasses and gloves, hand tools, a four-gallon capacity switch tank backpack sprayer, a job-site radio, a heated jacket and more.

# *Grown here,* **MADE HERE**

Try wine and beer or conduct an event at Chateau de Pique

It's unique at Chateau de Pique.

The facility at 6361 N. County Road 760E, Seymour, grows its own grapes for wine, brews its own beer and makes hard cider.

The tasting room offers an opportunity to sample before you buy or rent for a small event, and there's a patio outside the front door.

There also are outdoor and indoor venues that can be used for weddings, and the large tent can accommodate a wedding, party or other gathering.

The plan — hopefully in 2023 — is to get started on a recreational vehicle park with cabins.

All of this is right here in Jackson County.

“You can't beat sitting out here and having a glass of wine just to watch the sun go down. There's nowhere else like this in Seymour,” General Manager Todd Storey said. “In that tent, my wife and I sit up there all the time in the summer and late fall and you will never see a prettier sunset. It's just unreal. It's neat.”

With the holidays coming up, Storey said Chateau de Pique can be rented for Christmas parties. The tasting room inside the old two-story barn seats up to 125 and is available year-round, so it

also could be used for group meetings, bridal showers, birthday parties and more.

"It's a small, intimate venue, not a big venue, so smaller crowds," he said.

The room also has an area to sample the varieties of wine and beer and also buy bottles of wine. Hours are noon to 7 p.m. Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays and noon to 4 p.m. Sundays.

The white wines (Estate Chardonnay and Estate Vignoles) and red wines (Estate Cabernet Franc and Estate Chambourcin) came off of Chateau de Pique's vineyard.

"We actually have eight different varieties. Right now, we only have four bottled," Storey said. "We're getting ready to bottle the rest of them, but these are grown here, made here."

The winery also has two semi-sweet wines and nine sweet wines.

"We bring in different ingredients and then make them our own," Storey said.

Peach Bum is the best seller. It's described as "sweet, peachy and delicious," and Storey said it's really popular in the summer during weddings.

"You may have a peach wine somewhere. Great. It won't taste like ours. Ours won't taste like theirs," Storey said.

This time of year, Winter Welcome, a blend of strawberry and rhubarb, is popular.

"People love it," Storey said.

Blackberry is very popular, too, but he said they are about to run out of it for the year.

"We will have more in the spring," he said. "We're getting ready to bottle 2020's harvest, so we'll hope to have that sitting here, going in there (the tasting room) and we hope to sell through that, and this time next year, we'll do 2021's harvest and bottle it. We'll be harvesting 2023 but bottling 2021, so we're always like a year and a half behind."

Around Christmastime, Storey said the plan is to have two new ports. St. Croix is sweet, and Marquette is dry.

"We planted them four years ago, and it takes four or five years to get a crop, and for the first time ever, we're going to have these bottled," he said.

Chateau de Pique also has two of its own beers on top — pale ale and porter. Storey said they are trying to expand that, too.

Storey encourages people to stop by before they head out to a local restaurant.

"We want to be somewhere on your journey on a Friday night," he said. "Start here and have a couple wines, enjoy yourself and then go out. There are plenty of establishments in Seymour to go eat. Go frequent them. We want to be partners with them. ... Whether it's the beginning of your night or the end of your night, I don't care. You're helping another business in Seymour. You're helping all of us out."

For those planning to get married in 2023, reservations are accepted for renting any of the venues on the property. The large tent opens in April and remains available through October.

# SEASON'S SAVINGS

Tips to save on shopping

If you are shopping in-store, take your smartphone with you and ask for the retailer to match online pricing, which can sometimes be a better deal. Asking for this match can save you time and money on shipping fees you might incur ordering online.

**Check return policies.** Many retailers offer extended return windows during the holiday shopping season. Make sure you look at the details of retailers' policies to ensure you understand how much time you have to make returns and do not have to pay return shipping or other unexpected costs.

## Chorizo and Oaxaca Tamales

Prep time: 60 minutes  
Cook time: 60 minutes  
Servings: 10-12

40 dried corn husks  
Water  
3 packages Cacique Pork, Beef or Soy Chorizo

1 medium onion (about 1 cup), minced  
8 pounds basic tamale dough, at room temperature  
3 packages (10 ounces each) Cacique Oaxaca Cheese, cut into ½-inch strips  
Tamale steamer  
Cacique Crema Mexicana, for serving  
Cacique Homestyle Mild Salsa, for serving

In large bowl, cover corn husks with boiling water and soak at least 1 hour. Remove excess water and pat each husk dry.

In large skillet, cook chorizo according to package instructions. Add onions; saute over medium heat until translucent, about 5 minutes. Cool thoroughly.

To make tamales: Prepare one husk at a time by placing husk on open palm, smearing 3 tablespoons tamale dough on husk from side to side and to bottom, leaving 3 inches of top untouched for folding. Place 1 tablespoon chorizo mixture in center and top with one strip of Oaxaca. Fold ⅓ of husk to left and ⅓ to right, overlapping; pinch bottom to seal and

gently fold over top to create small rectangle.

Add adequate room temperature water to tamale steamer and set steamer grate. Place formed tamales, vertically and upside down, tightly packed. Once first layer of tightly packed tamales is complete, begin second layer of tamales horizontally.

Cover and steam over medium-high heat 45 minutes-1 hour. Check water level at 45 minutes. If water is low, gently add hot water to side of pot.

Remove one tamale to check doneness. Tamale is cooked when dough separates from husk when unwrapping. Serve hot with crema and salsa.

## Oaxaca, Potato and Chorizo Empanadas

Prep time: 20 minutes  
Cook time: 30 minutes  
Yield: 24 empanadas

### Dough:

1 stick, plus 6 tablespoons, cold unsalted butter, cubed  
4 cups all-purpose flour  
½ teaspoon salt  
½ cup warm water  
1 egg, at room temperature, whisked

### Filling:

1 package Cacique Pork Chorizo  
2 russet potatoes, cubed  
5 ounces Cacique Oaxaca Cheese, cubed  
1 egg, well-beaten, for egg wash  
Preheat oven to 350 F.

To make dough: Use pastry cutter or fork to cut butter into flour until it forms crumbly consistency. Sprinkle in salt and stir. Pour in warm water and egg; stir until clumpy dough forms. Knead dough about 5 minutes. Cut dough into 24 pieces and, using hands, roll each piece into ball. With rolling pin, roll balls evenly into 5-6-inch circles.

To make filling: In pan over medium heat, cook chorizo, stirring until it crumbles. Add cubed potatoes. Cover and cook until potatoes are soft then uncover and cook 5-10 minutes until liquid evaporates.

Fill empanadas by placing 2-3 tablespoons chorizo and potato mixture with 2-3 Oaxaca cubes in each dough circle. With finger, run egg wash across one side of circles. Fold over and seal edges by pressing down with fork or create folds and pinch to seal filling inside. Brush tops with egg wash.

Prepare parchment-lined baking sheets and place empanadas on sheets. Bake 12-15 minutes until golden-brown.
